

Application for Camp Site

The campground site is the property of SOSA. Campers apply for and rent the sites on a year to year basis. A campsite will be assigned to one “qualified camper”, who must meet the following criteria:

1. be a full flying (active*) member OR be a non-flying senior member that has been a member for over 10 years
 2. have been a member for at least one year (no camp sites for first year members)
 3. maintain a positive balance in their SOSA account
 4. accept, sign and adhere to the campground rules and regulations
- *fly a minimum of 20 flights per season

The Board of Directors approves the application and location assignments. Exceptions to the eligibility rules can be made at the discretion of the board of directors. Members wishing an exception must make the request in writing stating their unique situation to the board.

Camp Site Maintenance

Each trailer owner is responsible for their site being maintained throughout the season.

Grass will be kept short

Walkways and other “public areas” will also be maintained by the camper

There won't be any junk left around. This includes building materials, garbage, etc.

Loose branches and trimmings will be removed as they are cut down

If a member doesn't maintain his/her site the club will perform the maintenance and charge the member's flying account accordingly. The charge will also include a service fee.

Electric grid

Electric hook up is available for a nominal one-time cost as established in the club's fee structure. The electricity consumption is charged equally amongst all campers that are hooked up in the spring. Members that have air-conditioning or spend an extended period of time camping at the club will be assessed an additional cost.

Trailer removal

Trailer owners are responsible for removing their trailers when they are no longer a “qualified camper”, or their trailer is deemed unsafe. Should they fail to remove their trailer, the club will remove/dispose of the trailer and charge the member's SOSA account accordingly. Any structure, decks, tables, etc. left behind for a period of one year will become the property of SOSA.

Trailer Sales and Sublets

A campsite is assigned to one member who meets criteria and owns the trailer. If the owner of the trailer no longer meets criteria, they must remove the trailer, or transfer ownership to a qualified member. If there is no qualified member named to the site, the trailer cannot stay at SOSA. If a member sells the trailer, the new owner must apply to the board and meet criteria in order to keep the trailer at SOSA.
